INTRODUCTION

The Americans for Sovereignty® 2010 Congressional Scorecard is the only rating of its kind. It is based upon a detailed survey of the roll call votes in the United States Senate and the United States House of Representatives in the 111th Congress, Second Session (2010). Out of the hundreds of votes cast in the Congress, Americans for Sovereignty® has selected eleven votes in the U.S. Senate and eleven votes in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Each vote impacts American sovereignty and lets you know how your Member of Congress actually votes. This is the only such Congressional scorecard on sovereignty votes of which AFS is aware. Once again this year, there are both a rating for each Member of Congress for 2010 and for each Member's lifetime score. This gives you the opportunity to judge for yourself where your Congressman and Senators stand.

In order to draw crucial distinctions between Congressmen and Senators, most unanimous and nearly unanimous votes cast in the Congress have not been included. Instead the focus of the survey is on crucial issues that required Congressmen or Senators to cast a vote either for or against American sovereignty and where there was some disagreement. In both the Senate and House, votes were chosen that deal with issues involving the United Nations and its efforts to assert authority over the United States. Other votes on the protection of American Sovereignty involved radical nominations and internationalist treaties of President Obama. Other votes included American border security and maintaining a strong defense to protect American sovereignty. Some votes may be procedural but they impact American sovereignty and America's ability to defend itself.

The votes in the Senate and House are, of course, different, but the votes selected in each branch of Congress show how the Senator or Congressman acts on issues of American sovereignty. Detailed explanations are provided of the specific votes selected and why Americans for Sovereignty® has included each vote in the Sovereignty Scorecard. The percentage ratings are based on the actual votes cast by each Member of Congress. A 100% score means that a Member of Congress has voted in support of American sovereignty on each of the votes chosen where he or she voted. A 0% means that person did not vote even once for the protection of American sovereignty. A vote in favor of American sovereignty is designated by a (+) and a vote against American sovereignty is designated by a (-). An NV indicates the person did not vote on that issue.

Americans for Sovereignty® shall continue to monitor and publicize the votes in the U.S. Congress so that the public will be aware of how Members of Congress actually vote. Actual votes show which Members of Congress are most responsible for either protecting or sacrificing American sovereignty. Please let your Congressman and Senators know what you think of their votes.

111th Congress 2nd Session, House Vote Explanations

- 1. Motion to recommit with instructions, H.R. 2701 (Roll Call Vote 72), February 26, 2010** Representative Hoekstra moved to recommit this intelligence bill back to committee with instructions. The instructions included requirements that would help guarantee the collection of intelligence from captured enemy combatants and terrorists. He pointed out how the Obama Administration had not been prepared for the Fort Hood terrorist attack and the “Christmas Day Bomber.” A vote for recommitting was a vote for improving American intelligence gathering. The motion failed by a vote of 186-217.
- 2. On agreeing to the resolution, H.Res 1146 (Roll Call Vote 95), March 10, 2010** This resolution provided for a precipitous retreat from Afghanistan within 30 days. It would have resulted in more American combat deaths and the victory of the Taliban and other terrorists. A vote against the resolution is a vote for protecting America. The resolution passed by a vote of 225-195.
- 3. H.R. 2499 (Roll Call Vote 242), Apr 29, 2010** The so-called Puerto Rico Democracy Act would have allowed as few as 34% of the Puerto Rico population to win a vote for statehood. Additionally, it placed no language requirements on Puerto Rico to make English the official language. It has been reported that less than 20% of Puerto Rico’s population speak English fluently. Before being admitted to statehood, other potential states have had language requirements placed on them. A vote against this bill is a vote against this political correctness. The bill passed by a vote of 223-169.
- 4. Amendment to H.R. 5136 (Roll Call Vote 317), May 27, 2010** Congressman Patrick Murphy (D-PA) offered this amendment to repeal the so-called “Don’t Ask, Don’t Tell” laws dealing with homosexuals in the military. It places liberal social policy above the needs of the military and the ability to defend the nation. A vote for the amendment weakens American defense. The amendment passed by a vote of 234-194.
- 5. H.R. 5136 (Roll Call Vote 336), May 28, 2010** National Defense Authorization Act included repeal of “Don’t Ask, Don’t Tell,” did not provide for maintenance and refurbishment of ground based missile defense in Alaska, would have required the government taking over more areas that had been outsourced to private industry, and would have allowed the GAO for the first time to investigate intelligence agencies thus making intelligence gathering even more difficult. A vote against the bill was a vote for American sovereignty. The bill passed by a vote of 229-186.
- 6. Motion to recommit with instructions, H.R. 5136 (Roll Call Cote 335), May 28, 2010** Congressman Randy Forbes (R-VA) offered a motion to recommit with instructions that no funds in the bill could be used for the transfer or release of detainees held at Guantanamo Bay. A vote for the motion is a vote to protect the U.S. from terrorists. It passed by a vote of 282-131.

- 7. Motion to Suspend the Rules and Agree to the Resolution, H.Res 989 (Roll Call Vote 341), June 9, 2010** This was an end-run by liberal Democrats in the U.S. House of Representatives to get the United States to move on international agreements including treaties that would result in such policies as Kyoto and the cap and tax regulations that have been rejected by the American people. It required a 2/3 vote for passage. It failed by a vote of 241-170.
- 8. Motion to recommit with instructions, H.R. 4173 (Roll Call Vote 412), June 30, 2010** Congressman Spencer Bachus (R-AL) offered a motion that would have required an audit of the Federal Reserve. In a period of massive bailouts, including those of foreign banks and companies, more transparency is needed. A vote for the motion is a vote for transparency and against foreign bailouts. The motion failed by a vote of 198-229.
- 9. H.R. 3534 (Roll Call Vote 513), July 30, 2010** This bill included a new tax on American energy, imposes a de facto ban on offshore drilling, and billions of dollars in more spending. It continues the Obama/Pelosi/Reid policy of making U.S. energy production more difficult. The result is even more reliance on foreign energy producers. A vote against the bill is a vote for American sovereignty. The bill passed by a vote of 209-193.
- 10. On Motion to Concur to the Senate Amendment, H.R. 3081 (Roll Call Vote 564) September 30, 2010** This was another in a series of continuing resolutions to fund the government as the Pelosi-led House was unable to complete its appropriations bills — a Constitutional power of the Congress. The result is more spending with very little oversight of foreign operations and international organizations. A vote against the bill is a vote against business as usual. The bill passed by a vote of 228-194.
- 11. On Motion to Concur in the Senate Amendment to the House Amendment to Senate Amendment, H.R. 3082 (Roll Call Vote 662), December 21 2010** This was the final continuing resolution to fund the government under the Pelosi-led House of Representatives. In that past three years, non-defense, non-homeland security, and non-veterans discretionary spending had increased by 88 percent. This bill leads to even more massive federal borrowing — much of which is owned by foreign countries like China. A vote against the bill is a vote for more responsible spending and less foreign owned U.S. debt. It passed by a vote of 193-165.

111th Congress 2nd Session, Senate Vote Explanations

- 1. Table motion for S.Amdt.3701 to H.R. 4872 (Roll Call Vote 95), March 25, 2010**
Senator Jeff Sessions (R-AL) offered an amendment to deny illegal immigrants taxpayer subsidized health benefits and also require legal immigrants to pay into the system before obtaining benefits. This amendment would help make illegal immigration less attractive — thus reducing the number of illegals crossing our borders. A motion to table this amendment was made. A vote against tabling this amendment is a vote for American sovereignty. The tabling motion passed by a vote of 55-43.
- 2. S.Amdt.3760 to S.Amdt.3739 to S.3217 (Roll Call Vote 138), May 11, 2010** Senator David Vitter (R-LA) offered an amendment to require the Federal Reserve to provide more transparency and to make more difficult foreign bailouts. This amendment is known as an “audit the Fed” amendment. A vote for this amendment is a vote for transparency and against foreign bailouts with U.S. taxpayer funds. The amendment failed by a vote of 37-62.
- 3. Motion To Waive Objection to S.Amdt.4214 to H.R.4899 (Roll Call Vote 165), May 27, 2010** Senator John McCain (R-AZ) offered an amendment to provide National Guard troops to secure the border with Mexico. A vote to waive the point of order is a vote to secure American borders. The motion failed as it required a 3/5 vote of the Senate. The motion was defeated by a vote of 51-46.
- 4. Passage of H.R.4899 (Roll Call Vote 176), May 27, 2010** This bill provided supplemental appropriations for funds for American troops in Iraq and Afghanistan. However, it was also larded up with numerous other spending provisions that had nothing to do with our troops. The liberal majority refused to offset this spending with cuts in U.N. spending among other amendments. A vote against this bill was a vote for American sovereignty. The bill passed by a vote of 67-28.
- 5. Motion to Proceed to S.J. Res.26 (Roll Call Vote 184), June 10, 2010** Senator Lisa Murkowski (R-AK) offered this motion to move to her resolution that would have stopped the EPA from regulating greenhouse gases even though they, the EPA, had not been authorized by Congress to do so. The EPA’s action put the United States at a severe disadvantage to other countries like Russia, China, India, Brazil and others that have no such regulations. The EPA regulations also put the U.S. under Kyoto-type restrictions without the Congress approving them. A vote to move to the resolution was a vote for American sovereignty. This motion was defeated by a 47-53 vote.
- 6. Motion to Stop Debate on the Senate Amendment to H.R.4899 (Roll Call Vote 219) July 22, 2010** A supplemental appropriations bill to fund U.S. troops was used in the U.S. House of Representatives to add earmarks, force states to allow unionization of local police and firemen, and other items that had nothing to do with supporting U.S. armed forces. Defeating the cloture vote meant getting a clean supplemental that would fund U.S. troops without even more spending and mandates on the states. The motion to end debate was defeated by a vote of 46-51.

- 7. Nomination PN1768 (Roll Call Vote 229) August 5, 2010** Nomination of Elena Kagan to the Supreme Court. Kagan opposed ROTC at Harvard Law School even after the Supreme Court in an unanimous ruling upheld the Solomon Amendment. The Solomon Amendment requires universities accepting federal taxpayer funds to allow ROTC and military recruiters on campus. She also changed Harvard Law's curriculum to require a course in international law while removing the requirement for a course in U.S. Constitutional law. A vote against her nomination is a vote for American sovereignty. Her nomination passed by a vote of 63-37.
- 8. Motion to Stop Debate on S.364 (Roll Call Vote 238), September 21, 2010** Senator Reid (D-NV) tried to stop the debate on the defense bill without allowing amendments by others than those he favored. As a result, the bill, as presented, would have allowed homosexuals in the military and repealed the "don't ask, don't tell" provisions before the survey of the military was completed. This bill was pushing social policy rather than determining what was best for America's defense and armed forces. A vote against stopping debate was a vote for the armed forces of our nation. The motion to end debate was defeated by a vote 56-43.
- 9. Passage of H.R. 3081 as amended (Roll Call Vote 247), September 29, 2010** This bill made continuing appropriations for fiscal year 2011 including the State Department, foreign aid, and international organizations like the United Nations. It also had high levels of spending. A vote against this bill is vote for American sovereignty. The bill passed by a vote of 69-30.
- 10. Motion to Stop Debate on the Motion to Concur in the House Amendment to the Senate Amendment No. 3 to H.R. 5281 (Roll Call Vote 278), December 18, 2010** Senator Reid (D-NV) was to pass the so-called "Dream Act" in this bill. It would have allowed illegal aliens to remain in the country and encouraged more illegal immigration while doing nothing to secure our border. A vote against closing debate is a vote for defending our borders. The motion failed by a vote of 56-41.
- 11. Resolution of Ratification (Treaty Doc. 111-5) (Roll Call Vote 298), December 22, 2010** Senator Reid (D-NV) brought up the new START treaty for ratification during the lame duck session of Congress — very unusual for a major treaty. The treaty with Russia raised serious verification questions and placed restrictions on the U.S. that were not also placed on Russia. It also did nothing about China's growing arsenal while restricting the U.S. A vote against the treaty is a vote for American defense and American sovereignty. The treaty passed by a vote of 71-26.
